




Young Black men carry the burden of incarceration and gun violence victimization




New York City and Los Angeles have made dramatic progress and Chicago has lost ground



In 2021, the homicide rate for Black Chicagoans was the highest on record


Chicago Homicides per 100,000 Residents by Race of Victim, 1991-2022












