
CVILA Reach & Impact

- Supports leaders to more effectively manage their organizations and scale CVI






Program Details

Create a first-of-its-kind description of the national CVI management landscape.


Create blueprints for best practices in CVI management and training.

How we are meeting our research goals

- 1. Leadership Interview: Students in the Academy participate in 120-minute Zoom interview about their experiences and perspectives as a CVI leader.
- 2. Management Survey Interview: A colleague of the student's participates in a 120-minute Zoom interview about the organization's operations and management practices.
- **3. Classroom Observations:** Staff identify moments of learning during instructional sessions & immersives.

Eligibility & Application Overview

Scheduled Cohorts

Cohort 1: September 2023 – February 2024 Cohort 2: May 2024 – September 2024 Cohort 3: December 2024- April 2025 Cohort 4: July 2025 - Nov 2025 Cohort 5: January 2026 - May 2026

Applicant Eligibility Criteria

- Minimum **five years of experience** in the field of CVI.
- Currently hold a **senior or executive-level position** within a CVI organization that serves Black and Brown Communities disproportionately impacted by gun violence.
- While there is **no minimum educational level** requirement, candidates must demonstrate a high degree of motivation and interest in enhancing their leadership skills and the impact of their work.
- Demonstrated **experience implementing CVI strategies** in alignment with the values and principles embraced by the CVI Academy.

Organizational Eligibility Criteria

The organization:

- Delivers services in Black and Brown communities **disproportionately impacted** by gun violence.
- Has a primary service population of community members at-high risk of gun violence involvement
- Provides at least **one** of the following CVI services:
 - Street Outreach/Violence Interruption
 - Case Management
 - Hospital-Based Services
 - Intensive Mentorship
 - Survivor Services
 - Therapeutic Services
 - Youth Development/School-Based Prevention
 - Victims Advocacy
- Has at least **3 employees** and an annual budget of at least **\$300,000**.
